KMS PTSA Meeting MINUTES

February 12, 2020

Dennis Bryant called the meeting to order 7:00 p.m.

PRESIDENT REPORT- DENNIS BRYANT:

- For the 2020-21 year, the PTSA is in need of a president, VP, Treasurer, Secretary. By-Laws, lunchroom and 8th grade dance chair people returning for next year. The PTAC (Council district wide- also needs a president & VP).
- 7th grade curriculum night is 2/25/20. Can promote the need at that evening.
- Greg Garris can send a "blurb" to the elementary schools asking them to get involved with the school.
- Lesley Cross to ask Evening Street 5th grade parents to get involved next year.
- PTAC scholarship- for seniors awarded annually. Seniors apply and are awarded a \$500 scholarship. 3 per high school are awarded. The PTAC is running low on the budget fund for this asking for the PTAC to make a contribution. Voted to contribute- PASSED. Diane Smullen to write a check to PTAC and send it for \$400. This amount was budgeted in the budget for the year and we approved to send that money.
- At the recent PTAC meeting, volunteer swapping was discussed. This could help to allow parents to be involved in different schools so they could see their own child at their home school. More info to be coming out on this in the future.
- At the prior KMS PTSA meeting, we discussed the need for outdoor equipment for our students. Nikki Hudson
 and school board discussing a budget to figure out what they can do to support the needs for the schools across
 the district as the belief is some of the needs/desires are more school board expenses vs. PTA/PTSA expenses.

TREASURER REPORT - DIANE SMULLEN:

- Passed out the income& expense budget updates
- There is a Giant Eagle program that gives back to the schools. Diane has the steps on how to join that. Denise Barnes has a list of other locations that offer the kick back program. She's going to share.
- Concessions needs to be revamped. Discussion on who the money goes to, how is it run, who volunteers keeps it (i.e. basketball parents run it basketball keeps it for their warmup shirts etc.), a discussion on how to revamp this in the future, share equipment, etc. In 2019-20 we made over \$4500. Alison English is running this this year. This year we have raised about \$800.
- The positivity signs are up in the bathrooms now. They're in the student restrooms upstairs.
- Purchased t-shirts this year as a first time were a big hit. We still have 40 additional shirts needed Lesley Cross reached out to Mike Enneking, shirt distributer, to determine when the final shirts will be delivered.
- Discussion on the teacher mini grants and how to increase participation and maybe have a larger give for the teachers.

• Our auction and general income is down this year. Discussion on what to do if our earnings are still low next year, concessions, donations, auctions, what we need, etc. Marketing challenge. Parent only night? Talent show? Parent/Teacher Night Out. Could still do one this year still.
