Weezy Elliott (English)

Ms. Elliott has been the English Intervention Assistant at WKHS since 2004. She assists students with the English curriculum, including composition, literary analysis, and grammar review. Ms. Elliott prepares students for the Ohio Graduation Test (OGT) and provides remedial instruction for students at risk for failing the OGT after the first attempt. In addition, she provides support to English Language Learners across the curriculum. Ms. Elliott also works with the Intervention Assistance Team to help identify, construct plans for and follow up with struggling students.

Ms. Elliott earned her BA degree from Rhodes College in Memphis, Tennessee and her Education degree from the University of Arizona.

Kim Troutner (Science)

Mrs. Troutner is the Science Intervention Assistant. She works with students one-on-one and in small groups to support classroom instruction.
