WHEREAS, in connection with the issuance of the Outstanding Bonds, the School District executed a continuing disclosure agreement (the "2008 Continuing Disclosure Agreement") which 2008 Continuing Disclosure Agreement set forth requirements for the School District to disclosure certain financial and other information annually (the "Annual Report") in accordance with Rule 15c2-12 under the Securities and Exchange Act of 1934 (the "Rule"); and

WHEREAS, the deadline for filing the Annual Report varies between the 2008 Continuing Disclosure Agreement and all other continuing disclosure agreements of the School District; and

WHEREAS, the 2008 Continuing Disclosure Agreement permits the School District to amend it to cure any inconsistency;

WHEREAS, the Board desires to amend and restate the 2008 Continuing Disclosure Agreement to make the deadline for filing the Annual Report the same date for all bond issues of the School District, for purposes of ensuring compliance with the Rule;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Education of the Worthington City School District, Franklin County, Ohio, that:

Agreement for the Outstanding Bonds. The Board hereby approves amendment and restatement of the 2008 Continuing Disclosure Agreement (an "Amended and Restated Continuing Disclosure Agreement"). On behalf of the Board, the Treasurer is hereby authorized to execute the Amended and Restated Agreement, which agreement shall be in such form as shall be approved by the Treasurer and attached hereto as EXHIBIT A, subject to to any changes by the Treasurer not inconsistent with the purpose of this Resolution. The Treasurer is also hereby authorized to execute any other documents necessary in connection with the Amended and Restated Continuing Disclosure Agreement to carry out the purpose of this Resolution. The Treasurer's execution of such documents shall be conclusive evidence of the Board's approval of such documents.

Section 2 It is hereby found and determined that all formal actions of the Board concerning and relating to the adoption of this Resolution were adopted in an open meeting of the Board, and that all deliberations of the Board and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action, were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code."

Furthermore, BOE policy states

that the student must have attended at least four semesters in Worthington Schools and have achieved at least junior status. These students meet these requirements.

These are the fourth, fifth, sixth, and seventh such requests this school year.
