There were no visitor comments.

B-1-b Expedited Limited Partnership OFCC

Assistant Superintendent Randy Banks and Director of Business Services Jeff Eble presented tasks for master planning in response to the OFCC facilities assessment and an outline of participating in the ELPP process with the OFCC.

B-1-b Board/Committee Reports, Announcements and Updates

Mrs. Best met with the Student Advisory Committee before the board meeting and said that it was great to hear the students' responses to Dr. Bowers' questions and discussion items.

Mr. Shim said that he and Mr. Schare attended the Worthington Academy Open House. Mr. Shim spoke of how it was nice to see many parents asking questions as students are now applying for attendance to the academy. Mr. Shim also attended the Ground Hog Day presentation by MORPC (Mid-Ohio Regional Planning Commission) and said that the fifth annual Worthington Educational Foundation's Evening in Support of Excellence fundraising event seemed to create a lot of excitement and was very successful.

Mr. Shim also spoke of a potential liaison with Columbus City Council. Mr. Shim said he met with a member of council, Elizabeth Brown, who is also Senator Sherrod Brown's daughter, to discuss the pockets of poverty of the district's students who live within the city of Columbus.

Mr. Wilson, who was elected to the Ohio School Board Association's Legislative Platform Committee, said that he would like the board to consider passing a resolution for changes/suggestions in the legislative platform.

Mrs. Keegan spoke of the community's support for the Worthington Educational Foundation's Evening of Excellence event and said that staff should feel great. Mrs. Keegan also said that Thomas Worthington Art Teacher Kim Maurer invited the board to see her art display at the Short North Gallery Hop.

Mr. Schare provided his first legislative update of the year. Mr. Schare said that last week, the House Education Committee met to consider a number of bills, one of which is House Bill 113, an unfunded mandate requiring all schools to provide instruction in CPR and the use of an automatic external defibrillator. Mr. Schare added that a substitute bill was introduced that maintained the mandate but eliminated it as a requirement for a student to graduate and also removed the mandate from community and charter schools.

Mr. Schare also spoke about the legislature discussing House Bill 420 which would exclude students who did not take the state assessment from the calculation of a school or district's Performance Index and K-3 literary process grade. Mr. Schare expressed concern that by legitimizing the opt-out movement, it allows schools or districts to encourage low performing

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students to opt-out and eliminates whatever small incentive there was for students to take the assessments. Mr. Schare stated that the state assessments must be made meaningful to the students like they are for teachers, principals, schools and districts.

Mr. Schare finally spoke of House Bill 401; legislation that introduces transparency to charter schools, requiring financial and academic information on its website, and another bill that triples the funding for College Credit Plus, but the money is earmarked for homeschooled students only. Mr. Schare said that he is also looking forward to testifying against House Bill 212, legislation that, if enacted, would include replacing Ohio's education standards in English, Math, Science, and Social Studies with whatever standards school districts feel like using.

Mr. Schare, who attended several district curriculum nights, said that he enjoyed seeing the district making a more concerted effort this year to market offerings such as the IB Program, Linworth, Worthington Academy, PLTW, STEM, and the EBA as a collection of integrated programs. Mr. Schare also congratulated Worthington Kilbourne Guidance Counselor Brianna Abbot for her work on her blog, stating that her posts are very informative as to what is offered in the district as well as timely reminders of what must be done to take advantage of these offerings.

Finally, Mr. Schare recognized Superintendent Bowers for agreeing to participate in one of the auction items at the Worthington Educational Foundation's Evening of Excellence fundraiser.

C-3-c Continued Enrollment of Seniors Moving Out of District

Recommended motion: "...to approve the continued enrollments of Eshaan Kumar, Rohan Kumar, Viraj Kumar, and Qwentin A. Hill, 4 seniors, whose legal guardians have moved from the Worthington School District."

Eshaan, Rohan, Viraj and Qwentin are currently enrolled at Thomas Worthington High School. Their parents/guardians moved out of the Worthington School District. They would like to complete their senior year in Worthington Schools, and graduate with the class of 2016.

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According to the Ohio Revised Code, 3313.64(F), "Any child under the age of twenty-two whose parent has moved out of the school district after commencement of classes in the child's senior year of high school is entitled, subject to the approval of the district board, to attend school in the district in which the child attended at the time of the parental move for the remainder of the school year and for one additional semester or equivalent term." Furthermore, BOE policy states that the student must have attended at least four semesters in Worthington Schools and have achieved at least junior status. These students meet these requirements.
