INFORMATION AND PROPOSALS

B-1-a Visitor Comments

There were no visitor comments.

B-1-b Board/Committee Reports, Announcements and Updates

Mr. Schare said Ohio released its plan to comply with the federal Every Student Succeeds Act, ESSA, last week. Mr. Schare explained that the Ohio Department of Education, ODE, published a draft overview and that the full plan will be coming out February 2, beginning a two month comments period which ends April 3.

Mr. Schare informed the board that themes from the report included the following: 1. Ohio is not going to get rid of its more rigorous standards anytime soon, 2. The ODE got a loud message that the state's assessment system needs to be stabilized so it should resist changing anything for several years and to cut down on so many tests, 3. The overview commits that the ODE will

look at testing requirements but does not commit to changing anything, 4. The overview did say Ohio will not adopt a process for using the SAT or ACT as substitute exams at the high school level, 5. The overview hints that ODE will look at the Report Card to make them more user-friendly and understandable, 6. According to ODE, stakeholders were split on whether Ohio should have a single grade A though F for school districts even though the ESSA already requires the single letter grade for school districts anyway, 7. ODE is looking at using chronic absenteeism and student discipline incidents as a measure for student engagement and including that data on the Report Card.

Mr. Schare said that the full proposal will be out in a few weeks and that he would encourage everyone to take a look at it. Mr. Schare also added that it was important to note that ESSA's future is up in the air as the new administration at the federal level has already frozen new regulations including ESSA until they can be evaluated.

Mr. Schare also spoke of attending the screening of the movie, *Most Likely to Succeed*, and thanked the Worthington Educational Foundation for sponsoring the event. Mr. Schare expressed his thoughts and addressed some of the highlights of the film, stating that our district already provides a wealth of project based and experiential learning opportunities at the secondary level including STEM and the opportunity for integration of those classes is also present to some degree with Project Lead the Way. Mr. Schare added that the film also talked about internships which he felt are very valuable to the high school education experience and that we offer those as well through the Linworth Walkabout experience and the WKHS Senior Exploration option. Mr. Schare said the film highlighted a grading methodology that is performance based rather than test based which the district might consider as part of our overall grading conversation started by Mr. Gupta last year. Mr. Schare stated that he came away from the movie feeling pretty good by the things we are already doing and encouraged additional innovation as we broaden our understanding of the changing role of education and nature of employment in the next 10 to 20 years.

Mr. Schare said that he received the district's Quality Profile in the mail today and commented what a nice job our administration did. Mr. Schare said he loved how it highlighted our academic rigor, diversity of programming, and how Worthington truly strives to make kids college and career ready. Mr. Schare said that he also liked how we shared the fact that the district's financial picture is as good as its been anytime in the last century but also questioned how the community will feel when we start talking about a needed permanent improvement levy, bond issue, and operating levy, all within the next 2 or 3 years to maintain that status.

Finally, Mr. Schare attended the TWHS and WKHS basketball games last week and said he was treated to some last second drama as the WKHS boys pulled out the win with a last minute buzzer beater that completed a huge comeback. Mr. Schare then gave kudos to both teams for the effort as well as all administrators and students who came out to support those teams.

Mrs. Keegan thanked the Worthington Educational Foundation for screening *Most Likely to Succeed* too and said what she took away from the movie was that it was an interesting film and that it was great to be in a community where you saw so many people in attendance who started conversations about it. Mrs. Keegan, who is also on the SPAC committee, said that the committee has only had a few meetings, but if anyone has a pressing board issue that needs to go to the committee, they should feel free to email her.

Mrs. Keegan also stated that TWHS will host its Curriculum Night, February 1, for future ninth grade families and WKHS will have one coming up as well. Mrs. Keegan added that this event is always a good time to hear a lot about all of our program offerings and options. Mrs. Keegan said she also saw the boys' basketball game at WKHS but was happily at Thomas by the time the buzzer beater happened to see the girls' basketball team handily beat the WKHS girls' team.

Mr. Shim also thanked the Worthington Educational Foundation for funding *Most Likely to Succeed* and spoke of how it was good to see all board members and a lot of administrators at the screening. Mr. Shim said that the movie gave us a lot of food for thought as we look at the future of the district 10 to 20 years from now.

Mrs. Best thanked parents and teachers for organizing the movie event as well as the Worthington Educational Foundation for funding *Most Likely to Succeed*. Mrs. Best said that she was impressed with the amount of retired teachers who came to see the movie as it shows they are still engaged and interested. Mrs. Best also announced that the State of the Schools will be held Thursday, February 2, at 7:00 p.m. at WKHS and asked Superintendent Bowers to talk about the event. Dr. Bowers said that we are trying to get the word out about the event and that the night will highlight the district's students. Dr. Bowers explained that the goal is to connect with our community and highlight many of the items on our Quality Profile such as the successes in the district, upcoming challenges such as growth with our facilities, and how school finances work. Dr. Bowers added that the event will feature student performers and will last approximately 75 minutes.
