Bids were received and publicly opened on Monday, February 29, 2016 for Architectural Package 38. The total of the recommended bids, accepted alternates and construction contingencies is \$1,452,526, which is below the bid package estimate. Please see Enclosure C-3-c for the bid tabulation.

The project will begin in June and will be completed prior to the start of the 2016-2017 school year. This project was identified and will be funded from the 2012 Bond issue.

C-3-d Award of Contract for Architectural Bid Package 39

The total of the combined base bid, alternates and construction contingency is \$1,279,300. Please see Enclosure C-3-d for the bid tabulation.

The project will begin in June and will be completed prior to the start of the 2016-2017 school year. This project was identified and will be funded from the 2012 Bond issue.

Bids were received and opened on Thursday, March 3, 2016, for Engineering Bid Package 23, abatement of asbestos containing tile and mastic at Wilson Hill Elementary Schools in preparation for the installation of new flooring surfaces. A total of 5 bids were received. The recommended base bid is within the engineer's estimate. The total of the base bid and construction contingency is \$103,939.00.
