The Worthington Board of Education met for a Regular Meeting on the 14th day of March, 2016, at 7:30 p.m., at the Worthington Education Center.

Mr. Schare called the meeting to order with roll call:

The meeting began with introductions, the call to order and the pledge of allegiance.

<u>16-035</u> Mrs. Keegan moved the adoption of a resolution whereby the agenda be approved for the regular Board of Education meeting.

INFORMATION AND PROPOSALS

B-1-a Visitor Comments

Two parents from Worthington Estates and one parent from Colonial Hills Elementary Schools addressed the board expressing concerns over the district's growing enrollment and capacity issues. Parents said that they would like to see the board put a timeline of actions in place – sooner rather than later - to address these issues.

B-1-b State Report Card Data

Chief Academic Officer, Jennifer Wene, presented results from the district's state report cards released by the Ohio Department of Education.

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B-1-c Board/Committee Reports, Announcements and Updates

Mr. Shim spoke of how interesting it was to listen to Worthington Kilbourne High School's Black History Month Speaker, Charles McLaurin, who actually met and worked with Dr. Martin Luther King. Mr. Shim added that the TEDx event was great and loved being able to also watch the event online. Mr. Shim attended the three hour drug presentation Operation Street Smart, and said that it was very eye-opening, informative, and a good presentation for parents to watch on this issue.

Mr. Shim thanked Neil Gupta for inviting the board to the Columbus Council of World Affairs event and spoke of how he was looking forward to hearing about the Global Scholars Program. Mr. Shim attended the district's Pancake Day, stating that he goes every year to this very well run event. Finally, Mr. Shim gave a shout out to the Worthington Hills PTA and volunteering families for collecting over 10,000 items of food and assembling buddy bags for the Family Mentor Foundation.

Mr. Wilson, who also attended the Columbus Council of World Affairs event, commented that it was exciting that the Colonial Hills drummers performed. Mr. Wilson said that he really hopes the district gets involved in the Global Scholars program, explaining that the more the district provides the opportunity to expose students to make them more culturally and globally competent, is what we should be doing as a school district.

Mrs. Best said that there was a good discussion with the Student Advisory Committee on various topics, including online testing, grading practices, diversity, and how students can best learn about all options offered in high school. Mrs. Best also thanked Director of Elementary Education, Patrick Callaghan, and Coordinator of Language Arts, Tricia Palko, for all their hard work on the Elementary Connections newsletter.

Updating the board on Medicaid reimbursements, Mr. Schare explained that last October, when it came time for the district to get reauthorized to serve as a Medicaid provider, the board was required to fill out a form which was different this year. The form, which is a prerequisite toward receiving the \$500,000 in Medicaid reimbursement funds that our district is entitled to for providing authorized services to Medicaid-eligible students, requires Board of Education members to provide their personal social security and driver's license numbers to the Ohio Department of Medicaid. Mr. Schare, concerned that this personal information would become a public record and open up 3,000 plus school board members in the state to identity theft, asked the district's Financial Services department to research why this information was required.

Mr. Schare stated that the reauthorization process also implied that no reimbursement would be forthcoming unless the services that were going to be provided were prescribed by a doctor. Mr. Schare explained that currently in Ohio school districts, such services are determined by the IEP team in conjunction with the student's parents, which can be a complex and time consuming process. However, requiring a doctor to sit in on every IEP team meeting would be impractical, Mr. Schare added, and the doctor's services would still not be reimbursed by Medicaid.

Realizing that many Ohio school districts were not aware of the new requirements, Mr. Schare said that the district's Treasurer, Jeff McCuen, hosted a well-attended meeting for interested parties February 25th at the Worthington Education Center. Meanwhile, Mr. Schare added that

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board member Charlie Wilson, utilizing his National School Board Association contacts, has begun to alert congressional staffers to the problem as it has been difficult to ascertain if the new regulations are state or federal driven, or both.

Mr. Schare also noted several district events that he attended. On February 23, Charles McClaurin, an individual who was at the forefront of the right to vote for African Americans in the 1960's, spoke at Worthington Kilbourne High School, reminding all that the right to vote is precious and should never be taken for granted. On February 24, Superintendent Trent Bowers spoke at the State of the Schools event and Mr. Schare expressed that he hoped State of the Schools would become an annual event.

Mr. Schare, who attended Thomas Worthington High School's performance of Pippin, said that the musical was very well received and gave a special shout out to the orchestra who didn't miss a beat with some challenging numbers. Finally, along with judging partner and senior advisor to the board, Abramo Ottolenghi, Mr. Schare said that he and Mr. Ottolenghi saw and judged some remarkable projects at Science Day and that after attending Worthington Kilbourne High School's Academic Honors Night, he wanted to give a special shout out to schools that honor academic achievement as well as achievements in sports and other extracurricular activities.
