B-1-b Public Opinion Survey Results

Paul Fallon from Fallon Research and Communications presented the results of a recent public opinion survey to discuss the views that parents and community members have about school district building and facility needs.

B-1-c Presentation of the Five-Year Forecast

Jeff McCuen, Treasurer/CFO, presented the Worthington City Schools Five-Year Forecast. See Enclosure B-1-c.

B-1-d Board/Committee Reports, Announcements and Updates

Mr. Schare spoke of how the state's biennial budget wound up last week with Worthington winding up pretty much where Treasurer McCuen's forecast said it would, with a slightly higher gain cap, a little break on TPP reimbursements and no big surprises, except that the budget passed by the Ohio House wasn't really balanced so the Senate has to cut a little more. Mr. Schare added that the question regarding the state budget is always what exactly do we lobby for. Mr. Schare said that some of his colleagues would tell Governor Kasich to undo part of the income tax cuts over the last few years and raise the state income tax; however, Mr. Schare said that this would be bad for the district as Worthington Schools gets 20 cents back for every dollar of income tax we contribute, so unless the formula is changed, this would be a really bad deal for us. Mr. Schare then suggested that in his opinion, for a statewide revenue enhancer, the state should look at reducing the \$250k exemption for small businesses which essentially pays no Ohio income tax at all.

Mr. Schare further spoke of a few items on the state budget that he felt should be mentioned as all three proposals restore a little bit of local control. The first proposal is the restoration of paper/pencil testing which would again be optional for Ohio school districts. The second is the elimination of the Resident Educator Program which would allow Worthington to design its own program for mentoring teachers. And third, is an increase in the ratio of special education preschool students to staff members as current law requires a 1:6 ration and the proposal in the budget bill is 1:8. Mr. Schare also said that SB8 seeks to add a new charter to the Ohio School Facilities Commission which would allow a school district to apply for technology and/or school safety funds, SB82 would require schools to place a phone call to parents within 1 hour for child that is absent, and SB34 would prohibit schools from opening before Labor Day unless districts request a required public hearing a month before any calendar is adopted.

Finally, Mr. Schare said that the Treasurer's Advisory Committee (TAC) met last Monday and started discussing the ins and outs of the next levy, adding that there are a lot of considerations and that the group will be meeting with increasing frequency as we move to 2018. Mr. Schare said he also attended the East Side Orchestra concert last week, listening to the progression of pieces from 5th graders to high schoolers, and attended the Global Scholars presentation to parents, stating that the event is one more example of how Worthington is trying to have schools that fit the kid rather than the other way around.

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Mrs. Keegan thanked everyone for inviting the board to the many end of the year events.

Mr. Wilson said that tonight's Lion's Club recognition of the volunteers was excellent and that he attended an outstanding TAC meeting. Mr. Wilson added he was delighted that Treasurer McCuen is doing a financial constraints presentation to the Facilities Task Force because the last thing he wants is for the Task Force to recommend something fiscally that we are incapable of doing because of constraints on our borrowing capacity.

Mr. Wilson said that he attended the Implicit Bias workshop at Worthingway Middle School last week, adding there was a phenomenal presentation and that the teachers were so into the workshop they didn't want to leave but had to due to a PTA meeting. Mr. Wilson explained that the workshop was partially funded by the Worthington Education Foundation and that he would like to see it expanded to high school, middle school and others as well.

Regarding Mr. Schare's legislative report, Mr. Wilson stated the district will get \$21 million less in state funding then we got eight years ago in 2009 adding that this is a result of the fiscally irresponsible severe cuts for high income taxpayers in the state of Ohio. Mr. Wilson explained that what we should lobby for is to join Mr. Schare's recommendation of getting rid of the small business pass through exemption - as there is no data that shows it stimulates the economy - and to also start increasing the state income tax on high income earners where all the cuts in significant amounts have been made.

Finally, Mr. Wilson said he spent the last three days at the U.S. Department of Education's Teach to Lead Summit and that one of the highlights of the summit was Dr. Gupta's phenomenal presentation that was extremely well received. Mr. Wilson stated that he could not believe how many people came up to tell him what a great presentation it was, adding that Dr. Gupta quoted Superintendent Bowers on the importance of being kind to kids and that one teacher came up to him and said, "I wish our superintendent said this." Mr. Wilson also talked about Director of Elementary Education Patrick Callaghan's message of Hope at the summit and said that Teach to Lead is a wonderful learning experience and that he would like to see us explore something like a mini summit right here in the district.

Mr. Shim said that Superintendent Bowers did a really good blog and that having a student guest post to the blog was a really good way to kick off Teacher Appreciation Week.

Mrs. Best thanked Dr. Bowers for sending the board a great list of all the events going on in the district and also said she appreciated the Superintendent's blog regarding Teacher Appreciation Week. Mrs. Best also encouraged everyone to drive by Buffsview Elementary School as there was a nice sign out front thanking staff and teachers.
