<u>D-1-b</u> Resolution of Necessity of Bond Issue

RESOLUTION DECLARING NECESSITY OF BOND ISSUE IN AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$89,000,000 AND TO SUBMIT THE QUESTION OF SUCH BOND ISSUE TO THE ELECTORS (R.C. Sections 133.18 and 5705.03)

WHEREAS, the Board has determined that it is necessary to finance the construction, repair, improvement and acquisition of school facilities;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Education of the Worthington City School District, Franklin County, Ohio, a majority of all of the members thereto concurring, that:

Section 1. It is necessary for the purpose of renovating, repairing, improving, furnishing, equipping and constructing additions to existing school facilities, buildings, and infrastructure; replacing existing equipment and constructing various permanent improvements; purchasing school buses and related transportation equipment; site improvements; and acquisition of land and interests in land, to issue and sell bonds of the School District in an amount not to exceed \$89,000,000 (the "Bonds"). It is further necessary that there shall be annually levied on all the taxable property in the entire territory of the School District (commencing in 2018, first due in calendar year 2019) a direct tax outside of the ten-mill limitation to pay the debt charges on the Bonds and any securities that the Board may determine to issue in anticipation thereof. The Bonds shall be dated approximately December 1, 2018, shall bear interest at the estimated rate of 5.00% per annum, and shall be paid over a period not to exceed 30 years, as calculated under R.C. Chapter 133.

- <u>Section 2</u>. The question of issuing the Bonds shall be submitted to the electors of the entire territory of the School District at the election to be held at the usual voting places within the School District, on November 6, 2018. All of the territory of the School District is in Franklin County, Ohio.
- Section 3. The Treasurer of this Board is hereby authorized and directed to certify a copy of this resolution to the County Auditor of Franklin County, Ohio with instructions for the County Auditor of Franklin County, Ohio to certify the total current tax valuation of the School District and to calculate and advise, by certification to the Board, regarding the estimated average annual property tax levy, expressed in cents or dollars and cents for each one hundred dollars of tax valuation, as well as in mills for each one dollar of valuation, that will be required throughout the maturity (30 years) of the Bonds to pay debt charges on the Bonds.
- Section 4. It is hereby found and determined that all formal actions of this Board concerning and relating to the passage of this resolution were taken in an open meeting of this Board, and that all deliberations of this Board and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements, including Ohio Revised Code Section 121.22."

D-1-c Resolution of Necessity of Current Expense Levy

Recommended motion: "...to approve the following resolution:

RESOLUTION DECLARING IT NECESSARY TO LEVY ADDITIONAL TAXES IN EXCESS OF THE TEN-MILL LIMITATION

(R.C. Sections 5705.03, 5705.212) Incremental Current Expense Levy

WHEREAS, the amount of taxes which may be raised within the ten-mill limitation will be insufficient to provide an adequate amount for the present and future requirements of the School District; and

WHEREAS, a resolution declaring the necessity of levying additional taxes outside the ten-mill limitation must be passed and certified to the County Auditor of Franklin County in order to permit the Board to consider the levy of such taxes and must request that the County Auditor certify to the Board the total current tax valuation of the School District and the dollar amount of revenue that would be generated by an original tax (the "Original Tax");

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Education of the Worthington City School District, Franklin County, Ohio, two-thirds of all the Board members concurring, that:

- <u>Section 1</u>. It is necessary to levy not more than three additional taxes in excess of the ten-mill limitation for the purpose of current expenses of the School District.
- <u>Section 2</u>. The question of such additional tax levies shall be submitted to the electors in the entire territory of the School District at the election to be held therein on November 6, 2018. All the territory of the School District is in Franklin County, Ohio.

- <u>Section 3</u>. Such Original Tax and three incremental taxes (each an "Incremental Tax") shall be levied at the rates and for the periods of time set forth on <u>Exhibit A</u> attached hereto and made a part hereof, upon the entire territory of the School District.

Such Original Tax and Incremental Taxes shall be placed upon the tax list and duplicate for the tax years set forth on <u>Exhibit A</u> attached hereto, if a majority of the electors voting thereon vote in favor thereof, and the last year in which the Original Tax is in effect shall also be the last year in which each Incremental Tax shall be in effect.
- Section 5. The Treasurer of this Board is hereby authorized and directed to certify a copy of this resolution to the County Auditor of Franklin County, Ohio with instructions to the County Auditor of Franklin County, Ohio to certify to this Board the total current tax valuation of the School District and the dollar amount of revenue that would be generated by the Original Tax if approved by the voters of the School District.
- Section 6. It is hereby found and determined that all formal actions of this Board concerning and relating to the passage of this resolution were taken in an open meeting of this Board, and that all deliberations of this Board and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements, including R.C. Section 121.22."

<u>D-1-d</u> <u>Board of Education/Governing Board Resolution Authorizing 2018-2019 Membership in the Ohio High School Athletic Association</u>

Recommended motion: "...whereas, the Worthington School District of Franklin County, Ohio, has satisfied all the requirements for the 2018-2019 membership in the Ohio High School Athletic Association ("OHSAA"), a voluntary unincorporated association not-for-profit; and

Whereas, the Worthington Board of Education/Governing Board ("Board") and its Administration desire for the schools with one or more grades at the 7-12 grade level under their jurisdiction to be voluntary members of the OHSAA;

Now Therefore, Be It Resolved by the Worthington Board of Education/Governing Board that all schools listed as members under its jurisdiction do hereby voluntarily renew their membership in the OHSAA and that in doing so, the Constitution, Bylaws and Business Rules of the OHSAA are hereby adopted by this Board as and for its own minimum student-athlete eligibility requirements. Notwithstanding the foregoing, the Board reserves the right to raise the student-athlete eligibility standards as the Board deems appropriate for the schools and the students under its jurisdiction; and

Be It Further Resolved that the schools under this Board's jurisdiction agree to conduct their athletic programs in accordance with the Constitution, Bylaws, Regulations, Business Rules, interpretations and decisions of the OHSAA and to cooperate fully and timely with the Executive Director's Office of the OHSAA in all matters related to the interscholastic athletic programs of the schools. Furthermore, the schools under this Board's jurisdiction shall be the primary enforcers of the OHSAA Constitution, Bylaws, Sports Regulations, Business Rules, and the interpretations and rulings rendered by the Executive Director's Office.
