The CCSS Integrated Mathematics Support course is designed to be taken concurrently with either CCSS Integrated Mathematics 1, Integrated Mathematics 2, or Integrated Mathematics 3 to help the student keep up and succeed with the pace, rigor and accountability of the regular course. Support will include gap closing intervention, preteaching of concepts, and post-lesson assistance.
