She also thanked the special education teachers and aides but criticized the District administration for not providing more support. She cited the pandemic as exacerbating underlying issues. She also read a statement from Ms. Chrissy Bailey of 627 South Selby Blvd regarding special education. Ms. Bailey suggested the use of communication boards on the playgrounds and said that disability is a part of diversity.

Ms. Amelia Shearer of 6875 Bowerman Street East praised the work of the special education intervention specialists and of Principal Messenheimer. She said that communication needs to come from the top from the Superintendent and the Special Education department to address the gaps in special education.

Ms. Karin Hoyt of 1300 Donahey Street also spoke about special education. She said that girls are sold short in special education. She cited statistics about girls and ADHD regarding depression and anxiety. She said that mental health matters.

Ms. Rebecca Hermann of 7035 Reiber Street also spoke regarding special education. She echoed many of the previous comments. She appreciates some of the steps the District is proposing and suggested that the District reach out to state and federal entities for additional help.

Ms. Susan Vannasdale of 1195 Leicester Place also spoke about special education services. She echoed many of the previous comments as well. She believes that District funding reflects priorities and that grant funding shouldn't be relied on for special education teachers.
