# C-3-b Continued Enrollment of Seniors Moving Out of District

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Lilith and Regan are currently enrolled at Thomas Worthington High School. Because their families have moved out of the Worthington School District, Lilith and Regan would like to complete their senior years in Worthington Schools, and graduate with the class of 2018. According to the Ohio Revised Code, 3313.64(F), "Any child under the age of twenty-two whose parent has moved out of the school district after commencement of classes in the child's senior year of high school is entitled, subject to the approval of the district board, to attend school in the district in which the child attended at the time of the parental move for the remainder of the school year and for one additional semester or equivalent term."

Furthermore, BOE policy states that the student must have attended at least four semesters in Worthington Schools and have achieved at least junior status. These students meet these requirements.

This is the fourth and fifth such requests this school year.
