### <u>B-1-d</u> <u>Board/Committee Reports, Announcements, and Updates</u>

Mrs. Keegan gave thanks to all the folks at TWHS who organized Homecoming activities and invited the board. Mrs. Keegan added that a lot of staff members put extra time into Homecoming and it was appreciated.

Mr. Schare said he saw more kids per area than any parade he's ever seen at the TWHS Homecoming Parade, adding that the parade was a pretty special event. Mr. Schare said that he also participated with 1,473 elementary school kids in the Worthington Wellness Warrior Run and that the number of students who participated represented nearly 30% of all of the elementary students in the district.

Mr. Schare also stated that last week he and Mr. Shim attended a Pepple & Waggoner School Law Update seminar which he highly recommended to other board members. Mr. Schare explained that the format of the seminar was around 6 to 7 quick 30 minute sessions on current topics that any board member would be interested in. Mr. Schare also gave a legislative update stating that HB200 is the consolidation of the EdChoice Scholarship and the Cleveland Scholarship into a new kind of scholarship which is direct pay and no longer using the deduct method of funding charter schools, which is a good thing.

Finally, Mr. Schare met today with Representative Mike Duffey and Jennifer Wene to talk on how the legislature can fix the state report card. Mr. Schare explained that the purpose of the state report card is to give the public a sense of the quality and the characteristics of the local school district and how the local school district is doing; however, Mr. Schare added that we've gotten to a point where the state is disregarding this purpose. Mr. Schare also said that it's gotten to a point where no one cares whether you've gotten a great or lousy report card or what the report card says, which means that the state in producing the report card is wasting its time. Mr. Schare explained that Representative Duffey's vision is similar data elements, but simpler,

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with not all the complicated math, as well as for elements that don't require six hours of explanation for components such as GAP Closing.

Mr. Wilson reminded everyone that the Worthington Educational Foundation will hold its Wo'Town Hoedown Saturday October 21, from 7:00–10:00 p.m., at the Shops at Worthington Place.

Mr. Wilson said he also attended a two day OSU symposium on closing the achievement gap that was organized by Laura Justice, a parent here in our own district. Mr. Wilson said the symposium was excellent with experts from all over the world, and that there was a high degree of uniformity among these experts regarding the issue of white 8th graders being more proficient than 12th grade graduate students of color. Mr. Wilson explained that since we are approaching half our students being of color, we are approaching a situation where half of our population will be walking around with an eighth grade skill set unless we do something to address this issue. Mr. Wilson stated that the consensus at the symposium was that we've got to focus on early learning, especially the first two years of life, because studies show that by kindergarten the gap is so great it can never be closed. Mr. Wilson added that factors in the achievement gap include testing bias towards African Americans, unconscious bias, structural racism, parental involvement, gender, when a student starts kindergarten, and the most important factor, housing and the conditions of how and where the student lives.

Mrs. Best said the library board is working hard on its trustee selection which will come to the school board after the library's November meeting. Mrs. Best explained that the library will be sending her a list of applicants and timeline, and that she will update at the next board meeting.

Mrs. Best also asked Superintendent Bowers for an update of tonight's Student Advisory Council meeting. Superintendent Bowers said Mr. Shim and Mrs. Keegan joined the meeting and they talked to the students about school safety and the incident at TWHS last week, adding that the students overwhelmingly said that they still feel safe at school. Superintendent Bowers also said they talked about the concept of adding resource officers at schools and the pluses and minuses of doing this, communication around the TWHS incident, and student challenges around communication. Finally, Superintendent Bowers said that random drug testing was also talked about (most of the students were not in favor), the facilities planning process and what it means when the district talks about balancing the high schools, and school schedules, such as the amount of time for lunch and the positives and negatives of having on open lunch.

Furthermore, BOE policy states that the student must have attended at least four semesters in Worthington Schools and have achieved at least junior status. These students meet these requirements.

This is the fourth and fifth such requests this school year.
