Secondary factors to be taken into consideration

- State of Ohio County Warning levels (Yellow, Orange, Red and Purple) for Franklin and Delaware
- School clinic visits/1000 for COVID/Influenza-like symptoms (relative to historical trends)
- District level Student Achievement Data (high school, middle schools, elementary school
- Central OH data on rates of infection and positive testing for specific age groups
- Other specific building data may indicate the need for step down at a particular building (example, an outbreak in a specific building)
- Teacher, staff, administration, parent data/feedback
- Expert opinions of county or state level public health officials

The purpose of secondary factor analysis will be to assist and further guide decision making at each two-week interval.

Ohio Department of Health Order 4/5/21

- The requirement to wear a facial covering does not apply when an individual is under ten years of age.
- My recommendation to the board is that we <u>continue with masking for all students</u>.

Ohio Department of Health Amended Order 4/8/21

Amended Health Order Signed

(COLUMBUS, Ohio)—Ohio Governor Mike DeWine today announced that Ohio Department of Health Director Stephanie McCloud signed the <u>Amended Order for Social Distancing, Facial Coverings and Non-Congregating</u> to clarify that:

- Six feet of separation between tables at restaurants, drinking establishments and banquet facilities must be maintained unless there is a physical barrier between them.
- Other than the facial covering requirements, the social distancing, congregating, and capacity requirements of the order do not apply to religious observances and First Amendment activity, including activity by the media, as has been the case since the beginning of the pandemic.
- The K-12 mask requirement mandate remains in effect and unchanged.

Mitigation Guidelines

- All safety protocols will remain in place.
- We will work to maintain a minimum of 3 feet of social distancing in classroom settings and 6 feet during lunch times. (<u>Ohio Schools COVID-19 Evaluation</u> from January 29, 2021 supports 3 feet of distancing with masks in classrooms and on school buses.)
- Face masks must continue to be worn at all times. Double masking is recommended but not required, health officials have advised that wearing a mask with at least two layers of fabric is recommended. Masks should include multiple layers of fabric, especially gaiters. Face coverings should be cloth/fabric and cannot be made of mesh or cloth/fabric that is transparent (with the exception of plastic components of a cloth/fabric face covering that allow for viewing a person's mouth and face shields). Disposable masks are also allowable. Face coverings must cover an individual's nose, mouth, and chin. Worthington Schools will have masks on hand and will happily provide one for any student who needs one.
