- District took over administration of program a few years later--opened to all students
- Program became self-supporting in early 2000s


Transition & Present Practices

- Changes for accounting consistency
 - Staffing
 - Registration
 - Agreement
 - BCI/FBI Background Checks
 - Certificate of Liability Insurance
 - 80/20 Split ("Rent")



Offerings

- Spring 2016 Offerings
- 14-17 courses each term
- 39-42 classes each term; all but 5-7 run



Participation

- Prior to Fall 2014: 300 students per term (average)
