The College Board recently redesigned the AP Government curriculum and older textbooks do not thoroughly cover the new curricular expectations of the redesigned course. Additionally, the new course changed the focus of student's skill expectations, focusing on their ability to analyze and write about quantitative data and political cartoons, a comparison of Supreme Court decisions and minor cases, application of current events, and an argumentative essay that is based on their understanding of 15 "foundational documents." In short, the redesigned course offers a far more specific curriculum than before, and one that includes new skills that students need to practice repeatedly before taking the national AP Government test. No other textbook addresses the curriculum re-design and skill practice in the way that this textbook does. The other textbooks are more updated versions of their older editions, but they do not directly address the new curriculum in the way that the Waples, Abernathy book does.

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
