The choir rehearses once a week during recess with our school music teacher, Emily DePaul, learning a wide variety of choral music to perform at four concerts per year. Additionally the choir will compete in the Music in the Parks Choral Festival on a Saturday in May.

## **Additional Information**

• Attendance Expectations: Participation in Limited Edition requires teamwork, dedication in discipline in order to achieve the highest degree of musical success. Because of the infrequency of our rehearsals, attendance at each one is imperative to achieve a quality learning and performance experience. The music the choir performs is quite challenging and requires everyone's attendance at all rehearsals. Students who miss rehearsals on a regular basis jeopardize not only their own individual musical growth, but hold back the progress of the entire choir. Students who miss three rehearsals per concert season will exclude themselves from participation in the choir. When a student is ill and absent from school this does not count against them. Absences which do affect them are the times in

- which they choose to go out for recess, lose recess for behavior, lose recess for missing school work and suspensions from school.
- Music in the Parks Competition: In addition to the regularly scheduled concerts, Limited Edition students will travel to Mason, Ohio to participate in the Music in the Parks Festival. That includes a choral competition in the morning and spending the rest of the day at Kings Island! We will go on Saturday, May 13th. It will be an all day trip with students and chaperones leaving early Saturday morning and returning after midnight. Students will compete in the morning and have the rest of the day at the park. The package will cost \$100.00 for students and \$50.00 for chaperones. The price includes the cost for chartered buses (Fun Bus/Creative Coach Company Lancaster, Ohio), all day admission to Kings Island Point, and fees for the competition.
- <u>Fundraising</u>: To offset the cost of the charter buses, children have the opportunity to sell Butter Braids (Fall) and Little Caesars Pizza Kits (Winter). All fundraising is optional.
- Payment Plans: The cost of the trip will be broken up into 5 payments made in September, October, November, February and March.
   Students who have families struggling to pay for the trip will have assistance through fundraising funds, donations, and sponsorships.
- <u>Chaperones</u>: We will have 20-25 parent chaperones attend the Music in the Parks Festival with the choir. Students will be fully supervised throughout the day in groups of four children to one adult chaperone.
   All chaperones will have completed the district background check process by April 1, 2023.
