College Credit Plus Program



- Formally, Post-Secondary Option / Dual Credit
- Due to legislation this year regarding College Credit Plus (CC+), a 15 semester hour was provided to students on campus.
 - Next year, an additional 15 semester hours will be provided.

Options for the IB Programme



- Option 1: Continue the IB Programme and Expand Branding/Communication
 - Increase communication at the Middle School levels and Thomas Worthington High School;
 - Expand the core concepts of international learning to all students at Worthington Kilbourne High School predicated on a comprehensive plan and staff training;
 - Establish a branding plan with on-going Grades 7-10 Parent/Student nights, videos, website, brochures.
- Option 2: Phase Out the IB Programme
 - Finish the programme this year and provide the necessary classes for the two diploma candidates to graduate next year.
 - Commission a committee of students, parents, and staff to develop our future vision o international focus in Worthington City Schools.
