



Note from the Nurse:

Welcome to Worthington schools. As part of the enrollment process, please provide a legible, updated copy of the immunization record for each child including the name of the vaccine, the month, date and year each vaccine was given. The record must have the child's name on it.

If you do not have an immunization record or if your record is incomplete with the State of Ohio Immunization School requirements, your student will need to begin the immunization process to meet those requirements. Please bring your immunization record to the Columbus Health Department or Franklin County Health Department for a record review and to receive any needed immunizations. See below for information. You have 14 days from the enrollment date to provide the required immunization documentation to your child's school, or to start the immunization process if that is required.

If you are moving to Worthington from out of the country, please check to see if a TB (tuberculosis) test is required prior to starting school. Please bring your immunization record with you when you go for a TB test for a more efficient use of your time and to avoid any delays beginning school.

Columbus Public Health offers walk-in, no appointment necessary, vaccine clinics. Plan to arrive early as this is a first come first serve clinic opportunity and they may close the line early once their supply demand is met. The address is 240 Parsons Ave. Columbus, Ohio 43235.

State School Immunization Law, Sections 370.12, 3313.671 and 5104.011 (A) (5) of the Ohio Revised Code states that all students must have an Immunization Record on file within 14 days of entrance. ## Required Immunizations for School Attendance – OHIO

<b>DTaP/DT</b> <b>Tdap/Td</b> Diphtheria Tetanus Pertussis	<b><u>K-12</u></b> Four (4) or more doses of DTaP or DT, or any combination. If all four doses were given before the 4th birthday, a fifth (5th) dose is required. If the fourth dose was administered at least six months after the third dose, and on or after the 4th birthday, a fifth (5) dose is not required.	
	<b><u>Grades 1-12</u></b> Three doses of Td or a combination of Td and Tdap is the minimum acceptable for children ages 7 years and older with the first dose of being Tdap. Minimum spacing of four weeks between doses 1 & 2, and six months between doses 2 and 3.	
	<b><u>Grade 7</u></b> One (1) dose of Tdap vaccine must be administered on or after the 10 <sup>th</sup> birthday	
	All students in grades 8-12 must have one documented Tdap dose	
<b>POLIO</b>	<b><u>K-12</u></b> Three (3) or more doses of IPV. The FINAL dose must be administered on or after the fourth (4 <sup>th</sup> ) birthday regardless of the number of previous doses and there must be six months spacing between doses 2 & 3. If a combination of OPV and IPV was received, four (4) doses of either vaccine are required.	
<b>MMR</b> Measles Mumps Rubella	<b><u>K-12</u></b> Two (2) doses of MMR. Dose one (1) must be administered on or after the first birthday. The second dose must be administered at least 28 days after dose one (1).	
<b>HEP B</b> Hepatitis B	<b><u>K-12</u></b> Three (3) doses of Hepatitis B. The second dose must be administered at least 28 days after the first dose. The third dose must be given at least 16 weeks after the first dose and at least 8 weeks after the second dose. The last dose in the series (third or fourth dose), must not be administered before age 24 weeks.	
<b>Varicella</b> (Chickenpox)	<b><u>K-12</u></b> Two (2) doses of varicella vaccine must be administered prior to entry. Dose one (1) must be administered on or after the first birthday. The second dose should be administered at least three (3) months after dose one (1); however, if the second dose is administered at least 28 days after the first dose, it is considered valid.	
<b>MCV4</b> Meningococcal	<b><u>Grades 7</u></b> One (1) dose of meningococcal (serogroup A, C, W, and Y) vaccine must be administered prior to seventh (7 <sup>th</sup> ) grade entry. <b>All student grades 8-11 must have one documented dose of MCV4.</b>	
	<b><u>Grade 12</u></b> Two (2) doses of MCV4 by age 16 years, with a minimum interval of eight (8) weeks between doses. If the first dose was given on or after the 16 <sup>th</sup> birthday, only one (1) dose is required.	
<b>TB Test</b>	Students entering the district from a foreign country must provide evidence of a negative Mantoux TB test or chest x-ray report within the past 90 days prior to entering school	

I understand if the above immunizations are not in by the specified date, my child will be excluded on that day until the requirement is met.
