Change in Dismissal Plans?

If your child needs to leave school early or in a different way at the end of the day please be sure to send in a note with the following details: your child's first and last name, the date of the change, your child's teacher's name, the first and last name any other child or parent involved, your child's bus number (if relevant), your signature.

Tips:

- Please do not send one note that covers more than one day or more than one of your children. We need to have a note for each day and each child when the regular dismissal plan is changed.
- Be sure to call the office no later than 2:00 p.m. at 614-450-4700 with any last minute changes.

Bus Route

Tips:

- Transportation updates bus routes in early August.
- It is important to check bus route information each year. Do not assume your child rides the same bus as last year as routes and bus assignments change regularly.

Pick Up - Students can be picked up beginning at 2:50 p.m.




- Car drop off and pick up is on Candlewood Drive.
- We ask that you pull up as far as possible in the line before your child gets in or out of the vehicle. Please do not stop in the middle of the car line as this causes a delay in the process.
- Your car must be in the curb cut for your child to exit or enter your car.
- Please do not get out of your car when you arrive.
- Child should exit or enter vehicle doors closest to the curb.
- We encourage families to help their children practice buckling and unbuckling their seatbelt so they can be independent with this skill.



Absences

Parents/Guardians must notify the school office on the day a student will be late or absent unless the office has been notified in advance. Lacking parental notification, the school office personnel will telephone or email the parent or other emergency contact person of the student's absence on the same day the student is absent.



In addition to notifying the school office, it is always helpful to notify your child's teacher of any upcoming absences from school.

Celebrating Student Birthdays



Recognizing and celebrating the birthday of our students and their unique place in the school community is important to us. The incidence of students with dangerous food allergies and medical conditions such as diabetes has prompted us to rethink food consumption in our elementary schools. Doing everything we can to ensure our students' health, safety, and well-being is our number one priority! We welcome parents working with school staff to provide a special recognition of their child's birthday.

However, we will not participate in celebrating birthdays with food of any kind, including cupcakes, packaged sweets or other food or beverage treats. Our teachers have special ways to recognize each child's birthday, and parents are encouraged to share reasonable non-food alternatives for celebrating their child with classmates.

Non-food alternatives could include: Special pencils, Stickers, Erasers, Dollar-store word games or puzzles, A "class" puzzle or game for students to use in celebration of your child, A book could be added to the classroom or school library in honor of your child and his/her birthday. Every year you must confirm or update your child's emergency information and give permission for field trips, tech usage and the release of directory information. This process is also how you can make changes throughout the year.

Progress Reports



Worthington Schools has created a guide to provide parents with the following information about Elementary Student Progress Reports. Read the <u>Parent Guide to Elementary Progress Reports</u>.

A few points we would like to highlight:

- Progress Reports use a 1-4 Marking Key to report student progress related to both the level of expectation that is being met, as well as the level of independence with which a student performs. "3" indicates the expected level of performance for any student at any grade level by the end of the academic school year. See table on Page 2 of the Parent Guide for additional information about the Marking Key.
- A marking of 2 is very typical for the first trimester because students are still receiving support on things they will be expected to do independently at the end of the school year.
- Not all areas listed on the Progress Report are assessed each trimester. When an area is not assessed, the box will be left blank.
- Related arts teachers will report student progress during 1st and 3rd Trimesters.
- Beginning in fourth grade, students will receive letter grades for each subject. These letter grades are based on summative
 assessments in the form of projects, quizzes and tests. The grade reflects student academic achievement and knowledge of
 content material.

- Select "Elem K-3 Progress Report" or "Elem 4-6 Progress Report"

School Instructional Fees



The Worthington School district asks parents to contribute a little more than other residents for the cost of educating their children. There are additional costs for reading and math materials and other consumable supplies that are used in areas such as art, math, science and handwriting. The fees vary by grade level as the types of materials are different.

The money collected for these materials will be deposited in a school supplies fund that serves your school. These funds will enable us to provide your child's teacher with materials the classroom.

The fee schedule for the 2022-2023 school year is:

Kindergarten = \$24.00

Grades 1, 2 & 3 = \$42.00

Grades 4 & 5 = \$36.00
