# Academics & Testing

Worthington Schools is administering the **American History end-of-course test for Spring 2021**. All students who are currently enrolled in American History and AP US History, as well as those students who wish to retake the American History end-of-course test, are scheduled to take the test in April. Ohio just passed legislation to waive the state's American History test as a way to reduce testing this Spring.

Aligned with other Central Ohio school districts, Worthington Schools made a decision to still administer the American History end-of-course test. Although the state has waived the test, it is still tied to the Citizenship Seal, one of the state graduation seals available under the permanent graduation requirements for the class of 2023 and beyond. Therefore, students who do not take the American History test will not be able to earn the Citizenship Seal, which could affect graduation eligibility. In the best interest of our students, we want to be sure we offer every opportunity for each student to meet graduation requirements.

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## Update From the Health Office

#### \*\*\* COVID-19 Information\*\*\* Revised March 22

As we return to a normal schedule with all students attending school daily it is extremely important **NOT** to send your student to school if they are sick and not feeling well. A daily health check is required for parents and students to complete each morning prior to school.

Daily Home COVID-19 "Before School" Screening

#### Protocol for COVID-19 School Screening and Follow Up Requirements

If your child develops or reports any of the symptoms listed below during the school day they will be isolated and a parent or guardian will be called for immediate pick up. Follow-up with a health care provider will be required for your student to return to school. The COVID-19 protocols will be strictly enforced to ensure a healthy environment for our students and staff.

#### Your child needs to be kept home if any of the following symptoms are present:

- Temperature 100.4 degrees Fahrenheit or higher when taken by mouth
- New or worsened cough
- Loss of taste or smell
- Sore throat
- Nasal congestion or runny nose
- Vomiting or diarrhea

#### Your child needs to be kept home if TWO or more of the following symptoms are present:

- Headaches
- Body aches
- Fatigue
- Nausea

#### Quarantine Guidelines for a Positive Case WITHIN THE HOME:

- All students within the home should quarantine, from school and activities, following a positive test of a family member.
- This would also apply to a symptomatic family member who is awaiting a test result.

#### **Quarantine Guidelines for a Positive Case AT SCHOOL:**

- According to the Columbus Public Health department, if a student not wearing a mask is found to be within 3 feet of
  a person who tested positive for COVID-19 for more than 15 minutes, the student must quarantine from school
  and all other activities.
- If a student is found to be between 3 feet and 6 feet of a person who tested positive with COVID-19 for more than 15 minutes while wearing masks, the student may attend school and they can participate in after-school activities, including sports.
- Finally, if a student is found to be more than 6 feet of a person who tested positive with COVID-19, the student does not need to be quarantined. (6ft is still the standard outside of school)

#### Other Exemptions to the Quarantine Guidelines:

- Students that have had a positive COVID-19 test within the past 90 days are exempt.
- Students that have had two doses of the COVID-19 vaccine are also exempt.

#### Juniors may leave for Open Lunch, with parent permission

On March 22 we resumed "All-In" Learning and students are attending school every day. (No more Blue/Green days!) In order to maintain social distancing during the four lunch periods, juniors are being given the opportunity to have Open Lunch for a limited time, with parent permission. ## Guidelines for picking up students after school

After-school traffic is heavier than normal with the return to All-In learning. Please be patient! Parents are encouraged to consider delaying pick-up until around 3:15 -- it would really help to reduce the traffic jam around 3:00pm with cars waiting for school to be out and buses turning in to the front of school to make the end-of-the-day run.

- The **Bus-only Lane** will be curbside right in front of the building. This curb is painted Yellow, indicating no parking or waiting during the day.
- There are 4 pick-up zones for parents to use during after-school pickup according to the first letter of the student's last name:
  - Zone I:
    - o **A-B** will pick up in **Zone #I** in the Front East Zone, along the left of the median strip.
    - o L-M will pick up in Zone #1 in the Front East Zone, along the left of the median strip.
  - Zone 2:
    - o **C,D,E** will pick up in **Zone #2** in the Front West Zone, along the left of the median strip.
    - o N, O, P, R will pick up in **Zone #2** in the Front West Zone, along the left of the median strip.
  - **Z**one 3:
    - o **F,G,H** will pick up in **Zone #3** at the Athletic Entrance around the back of the school.
    - o **S, T** will pick up in **Zone #3** at the Athletic Entrance around the back of the school. (continued. . .)
  - Zone 4:
    - o I, J, K will pick up in Zone #4 at the Art Wing / Tech Entrance around the back of the school.
    - o **U, V, W,Y,Z** will pick up in **Zone #4** at the Art Wing / Tech Entrance around the back of the school.

Parents picking up students along the left of the front median strip (Zones I and 2) should stay in the LEFT lane in the entrance driveway. DO NOT BLOCK THE CORNER AS YOU TURN INTO THE PICKUP ZONE – this creates backups on Hard Road. If necessary, please pull ahead to the EAST parking lot and wait for your student there.

Parents picking up students at the back of the school (Zones 3 and 4) should stay in the RIGHT lane in the entrance driveway and drive to the right of the school building, around to the back.
