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### EPIPEN® (EPINEPHRINE) AUTO-INJECTOR DIRECTIONS:

- 1. Remove the EpiPen/Epipen Jr. Auto-Injector from the clear carrier tube.
- 2. Pull off the blue safety release cap by pulling straight out while keeping orange tip (needle end) pointing downward.
- 3. Swing and firmly push orange tip against mid-outer thigh until it "clicks".
- 4. Hold firmly in place for 3 seconds. (count slowly 1,2,3).
- 5. Remove auto-injector and massage the area for 10 seconds.



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#### ADRENACLICK® (EPINEPHRINE INJECTION, USP) DIRECTIONS:


- 1. Remove the outer carrying case.
- 2. Remove both end caps labeled. Sometimes they are labeled #1 or #2.
- 3. Place red rounded tip against mid-outer thigh at a 90-degree angle.
- 4. Press down and hard and hold firmly against thigh for approximately 10 second
- 5. Remove from thigh and massage the area for 10 seconds.






### **AUVI-Q® (EPINEPHRINE INJECTION, USP) DIRECTIONS:**

- 1. Remove Auvi-Q from the outer case.
- 2. Pull off red safety guard.
- 3. Place black end of Auvi-Q against the middle of the outer thigh.
- 4. Press firmly until you hear a click and hiss sound and hold in place for 2 seconds.





#### ADMINISTRATION AND SAFETY INFORMATION FOR ALL AUTO-INJECTORS

- 1. Call 911 immediately when administering an epinephrine auto-injector
- 2. If administering to a young child, hold their leg firmly in place before and during injection to prevent injuries.
- 3. Epinephrine can be injected through clothing if needed.
- 4. Do not put your thumb, fingers or hand over the tip (orange or red tip) of the auto-injector or inject into any body part other than mid-outer thigh. In case of accidental injection go immediately to the nearest emergency room or call 911.
